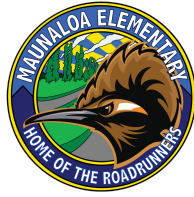


Principal's Report for School Community Council: SY 2023-2024

 - *The purpose of the Title 1, Part A grant is to provide all children with a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps (ESEA 1001).*

- *The HDOE Title 1 eligibility for SY 23-24 will continue to be based on a minimum poverty threshold of 47.2%. A school's poverty percentage is determined by the total lunch count divided by the official enrollment count. For schools applying the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), the total lunch count is a product of the direct certification count multiplied by a 1.6 multiplier. For all other schools, the total lunch count is determined by the number of students qualifying for free and reduced price meals.*
